

# FAFSA CHECKLIST: Have These Documents On-Hand

## GET IT... GOT IT... CHECK IT OFF~

Having the following information and forms on-hand will help you fill out the 2022-23 FAFSA:

- FSA ID for both the student and one parent \*
- Social Security Number for student and parents
- Your driver's license (if any)
- W-2 Forms from 2020 and other records of any money earned
- Your (and/or your parents') 2020 Federal Income Tax Return
- Any untaxed income records for 2020 — e.g., payments to tax deferred pension and savings plans, tax exempt interest and child support received in 2020
- Records of taxable earnings from Federal Work-Study or other need-based work programs in 2020
- Records of any grants, scholarships, and fellowship aid that was included in your or your parents' 2020 adjusted gross income (AGI)
- Any current bank statements
- Any current business and investment mortgage information, business and farm records, stock, bonds and other investment records
- Documentation that you are a U.S. permanent resident or other eligible noncitizen, if applicable

\* For high school students - To obtain an FSA ID before coming, log in to [www.fsaaid.ed.gov](http://www.fsaaid.ed.gov) and create an FSA ID for the student and one parent. Be certain to use the information for the person applying for the FSA ID, including a separate email for each person. **The FSA ID must be obtained at least three days prior to FAFSA completion.**

For returning students – Please be sure that you and your parent can log into your existing FSA ID. If you've forgot your username or password, go to “Manage My FSA ID” tab on [www.fsaaid.ed.gov](http://www.fsaaid.ed.gov) and click on Forgot My Username or Forgot My Password. If you have forgotten both, select Forgot My Username first.
